The FCHN is seeking a motivated and compassionate **Junior or Senior Nursing Student** to join our team as a **Student Nurse Intern**. This position will offer the opportunity to contribute to the mission of the Faith Community Health Network while gaining experience in community health, nursing, and nonprofit operations. In addition, this intern will have opportunities to assist in creating and maintaining social media content to promote the organization's activities, events, and services. The student nurse intern position expires upon completion of the student nursing degree or exit from nursing program/courses.

Position Title: Student Nurse Intern - Faith Community Health Network

Location: Remote meets on Zoom – 2nd Mondays 5-7pm January, March, May, July, September and November

Reports To: Executive Director and/or Board Chair

Position Type: Part-time / Internship (Flexible hours)

Key Responsibilities:

1. Nursing student voice on Board:

- Attend, participate and engage in board meetings (6 meetings a year).
- Communicate with your nursing program students and staff regarding FCHN community events and educational activities.
- Maintain school /course work to successfully complete nursing degree on time.

2. Social Media & Digital Engagement:

- Regularly update and manage the organization's social media accounts as able (Facebook, Instagram, Twitter, LinkedIn, etc.).
 1. Assist Executive Director to create posts/media that highlight key initiatives, community events, health tips, and patient success stories.
 2. Monitor social media channels for engagement and report to Executive Director inquiries or comments as needed and as able.

3. Professional Development:

- Participate in ongoing training, workshops, and webinars related to community health, nonprofit management, and nursing as able.
- If your school and the FCHN engage in cooperative affiliation agreement for activities related to courses taken for credits, students may be able to:
 1. Engage in supervised clinical learning experiences under the mentorship of licensed Faith Community Nurses and other healthcare professionals.
 2. Engage in research related data collection.
 3. Engage in board related activities that result in course credits.
